The ceremonial goal-shooting event followed, officially inaugurating the field amidst the melodious strains of our school song and the robust cheers of the audience.

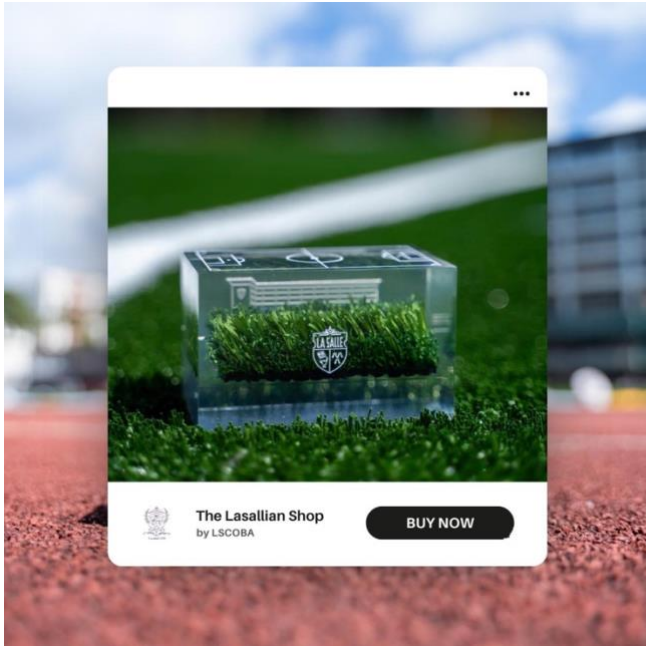

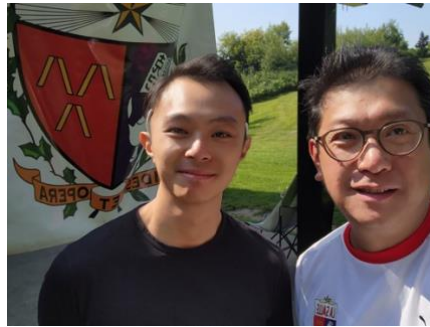

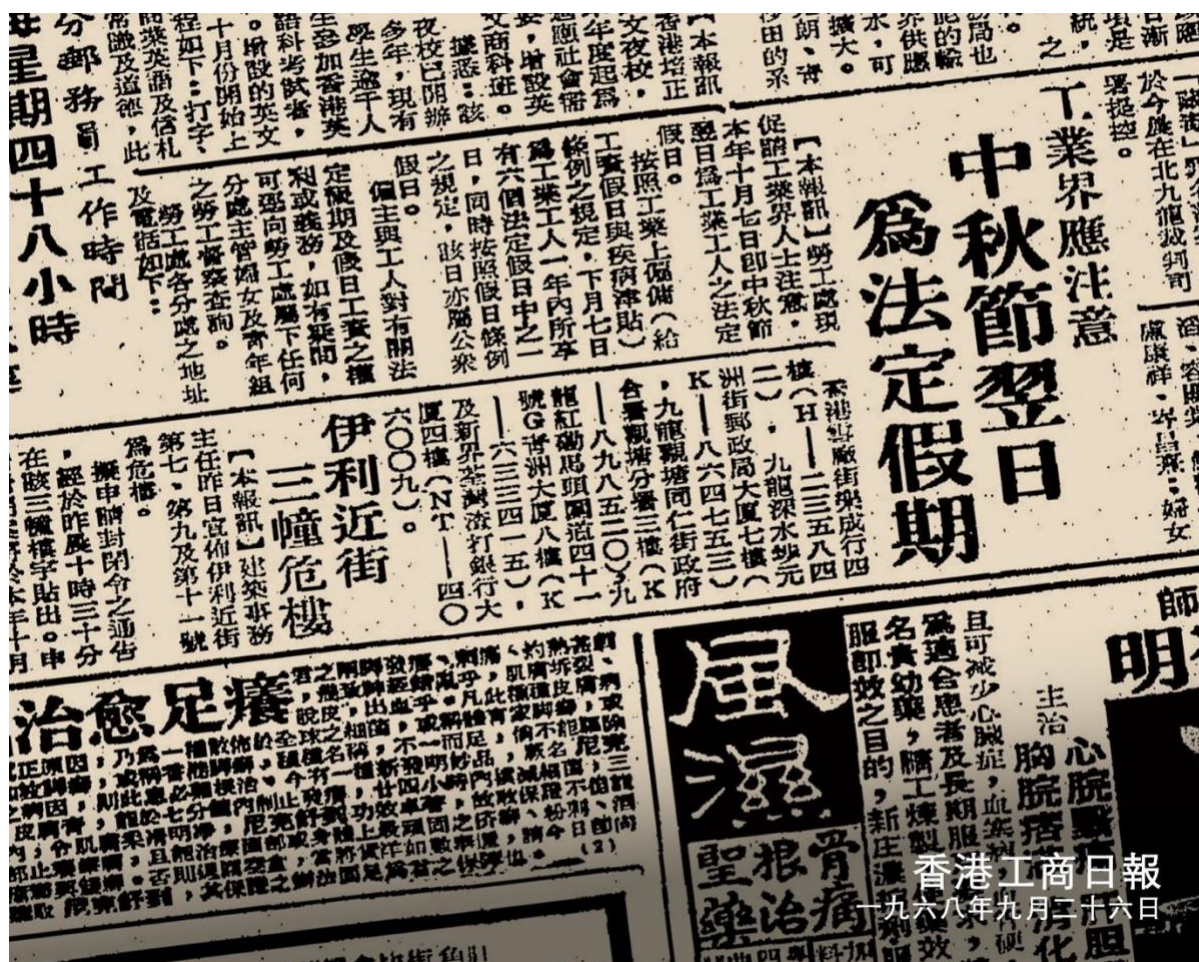

## World Cup 1974 – Total Football (part 3)

### Another worthy winner

Poland, the conqueror of England in the qualifier, would reach the World Cup at its full height. The reigning Olympics champion pressurized the opponents with vertical and direct movement. The front three of Lato, Gadocha and Szarmach were fast and furious who combined 12 goals together. Lato won the Golden Boot Award with his 7 strikes. The team was engineered by midfield dynamite Deyna who scored 3 goals himself. Goalkeeper Tomaszewski was the shining star with his spectacular style and 2 penalty saves. The team was entertaining with its gung ho style but lacked the bench depth and a flexible and alternative plan in a full tournament. They knocked out Italy, Argentina, Sweden and Yugoslavia but found it hard to go against stronger teams. Just like Brazil in the other second group stage, they needed to beat Germany to get into the final. In that fateful game, the pitch was soaking wet with heavy rain. The game was delayed an hour for the workers to clear the pitch. The first half was disastrous as game flow was constantly disrupted by the slippery pitch. The Germans, with superior skills, maintained ball possession slightly better. Maier did well to block a few difficult shots including 2 successive point blanks. The game restarted after a humongous cleaning task during half time. The Germans were awarded a penalty but Tomaszewski saved well from Hoeness. Mueller was eventually left unmarked inside the penalty box and his shot gave Germany the passage to the final. In the third place match, Poland beat Brazil with a smart Lato goal, a perfect breakaway run from the half way line to beat the offside trap.
