我们沉重悼念喇沙师兄,香港交易所(00388)前行政總裁周文耀(Paul Chow)近日的离世。

65 年喇沙畢業后入港大,1973 年從 IBM 轉到當時被喻為「金融界少林寺」嘅新鴻基證券工作。1989 年出任港交所前身嘅聯合交易所營運及技術總監,1990 年出任香港結算行政總裁,任內香港首個中央結算及交收系統(CCASS)推出,而喺 1996 年推出新一代 AMS 後,證券交易再不局限喺中環交易大堂內進行。



佢喺 1991 年接任聯交所行政總裁至 1997 年退任,期間積極參與並促成中資企業來港上市,即紅籌股熱潮,又引入受監管的沽空和股票借貸等安排,並推出股票期權。之後 Paul 加入滙豐轉職投資界,直到 2003 年重返已上市嘅港交所,任內又引入 H 股股指期貨及期權、牛熊證、並喺 2008 年推出「披露易」網站及「CCASS 網上股權披露服務」, 2009 年港股新股集資全球稱冠。

Paul 予人嘅印象係敦厚嘅謙謙君子,平易近人,作風踏實。

香港有今日嘅國際金融中心地位,係多得如 Paul 呢類難得嘅人才積極為香港作出貢獻,祝願 Paul 师兄安息!
