Candidates up to the number of vacancies who shall receive most votes shall be declared elected and in the case of two or more candidates receiving an equal number of votes, a second and subsequent ballots shall be held until a candidate receives most votes."

Any member who wishes to stand for election at the Annual General Meeting should complete the nomination form attached to this notice and return it to the Returning Officer on or before 21 July, 1992. Members are also reminded to bring their membership cards to the Annual General Meeting to facilitate the conduct of business.

Over 50 members attended the above AGM and the reunion dinner that followed.

Six sub-committees, dealing with activities, members liaison, publications, sports, Christmas Ball and careers advisory were appointed by the committee to handle the various aspects of work of the Association.

Mr. Michael CHAN was re-appointed as Honorary Auditor.

ACTIVITIES

(a) Spring Dinner

The festive event was held on 28 February 1992 at the Serenade Chinese Restaurant of the Hong Kong Cultural Centre. About 220 old boys and guests came along. It formed part of the activities in celebrating the 60th Anniversary of the College.

(b) Christmas Ball 1991

This was held at the Grand Hyatt Hong Kong on 24 December 1991. About 400 old boys and guests attended the Ball. In addition to enjoying the excellent performance of Shirley KWAN, those present also generously raised about \$300,000 which was donated to the La Salle Foundation in an auction of Rev. Bro. Henry's paintings.

(c) Soccer Tournament

Seven teams formed by various years of old boys participated in the soccer tournament held during the year. Over 100 players enjoyed the matches. The championship went to the team of old boys of 1985.

(d) 60th Anniversary Exhibition

To commemorate the 60th Anniversary of the College an exhibition on the history of the school and the Old Boys' Association was organised during the open days of the school held on 25 and 26 April 1992. The exhibition attracted much attention of fellow students, parents and visitors.

(e) Other Activities

A pool-side barbecue was held at the Yau Yat Chuen City Garden Club on 26 October 1991. Two race days were arranged on 24 November 1991 and 25 April 1992. These activities were well enjoyed by old boys and their family members.

LA SALLE FOUNDATION

The Association assisted in the formation of the La Salle Foundation during the year. In many of its activities, opportunities were taken to help raising of funds for the Foundation. The Association made a donation of \$100,000 from the Christmas Ball and current assets to the Foundation during the year.

USE OF SPORTS FACILITIES OF THE COLLEGE

On Sundays, members of the Association and their immediate family members were invited to make use of the sports facilities of the school. This provided a venue for old boys to meet their old schoolmates as well as to keep them fit and healthy.

(Users of the gymnasium are once again reminded that they must wear proper type of badminton or squash shoes to ensure that damage is not done to the wooden flooring.)

SPONSORSHIP FOR CAREER GUIDANCE

The Careers Day, an annual event sponsored by the Association, was held on 14 June 1992. Old boys from selected professions were invited to share their experience with over 150 school leavers and to give them an insight into their future choice of careers.

The Association also sponsored the publication of the La Salle Students Guidance Centre Newsletter which is considered one of the best of its kind in Hong Kong.

ADMINISTRATION

(a) Donations

During the year, the Association continued the tradition of rendering support to worthwhile activities and projects undertaken by the College or her students. Sums donated are detailed in the Hon. Treasurer's statement of accounts.

(b) Souvenir Items

Stock of shields, car badges and old boys' ties bearing the LSC insignia were available for sale. The old boy tie designed in 1990 remained to be popular among members.

(c) Newsletter

During the year four issues were published keeping members in Hong Kong and overseas informed of news about the Association, the College and their fellow old boys.
