The Association has received a Special Notice pursuant to Section 132(1) of the Companies Ordinance, proposing that the re-appointment of Chan, Wong, Chung & Co., C.P.A. as auditors of the Association to hold office until the conclusion of the next Annual General Meeting.

We have audited the accounts on pages 2 to 5 which have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in Hong Kong.

Respective responsibilities of directors and auditors

The Companies Ordinance requires the directors to prepare accounts which give a true and fair view. In preparing accounts which give a true and fair view it is fundamental that appropriate accounting policies are selected and applied consistently.

It is our responsibility to form an independent opinion, based on our audit, on those accounts and to report our opinion to you.

Basis of opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Statements of Auditing Standards issued by the Hong Kong Society of Accountants. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the accounts. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the directors in the preparation of the accounts, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the circumstances of La Salle College Old Boys' Association Limited, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance as to whether the accounts are free from material misstatement. In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the accounts. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

Opinion

In our opinion the accounts give a true and fair view of the state of the affairs of the La Salle College Old Boys' Association Limited as at March 31, 2001 and of its surplus for the year then ended and have been properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Ordinance.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

1 LEGAL STATUS

The La Salle College Old Boys' Association Limited (referred to as "the Association" herein) was incorporated under the Companies Ordinance and is limited by guarantee.

2 PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles in Hong Kong and with accounting standards issued by the Hong Kong Society of Accountants. The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention.

(b) Revenue recognition

(i) Membership subscriptions are recognized in the financial year of receipt.

- (ii) Income from sale of stocks and other sundry items is recognized when the significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods are transferred to the buyers and the Association retains no more effective control over the goods.
- (iii) Income from functions is recognized when the events are completed.
- (iv) Donations and dividends revenue are recognized in the year in which they are being received by the Association.
- (v) Interest income is recognized on a time proportion basis that takes into account the effective yield on the bank deposits.

(c) Depreciate of fixed assets

Depreciation of fixed assets is calculated to write off the cost of assets over their estimated useful lives, using the straight line method at annual rate of 20%.

(d)Investment securities

Investment securities are stated at cost less any provision for diminution in value. The carrying amounts of individual investments are reviewed at each balance sheet date to assess whether the fair values have declined below the carrying amounts. When a decline other than temporary has occurred, the carrying amount of such securities should be reduced to its fair value. The amount of the reduction is recognized as an expense in the profit and loss account.

(e) Stocks

Stocks, comprising shields, ties and souvenirs, are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is determined on a first in, first out basis and includes all cost of purchase, costs of conversion, and other costs incurred in bringing the inventories to their present location and condition.

(f) Accounts receivable

Provision is made against accounts receivable to the extent which they are considered to be doubtful. Accounts receivable in the balance sheet are stated net of such provision.

3 DIRECTORS' REMUNERATION

None of the directors received any emoluments in respect of their services rendered to the Association during the year. (2000: nil)

4 TAXATION

The Association is exempt from Hong Kong profits tax by virtue of Section 24(1) of the Inland Revenue Ordinance.
