To our La Salle schoolmates, memorial flowers had been nicely presented in both the mass and the burial. Thank you for your kindness and love towards Baltazar! 



## Newspaper Interview of Principle Tong

Newspaper Interview of Principle Tong

Recently, an interview of Principal TONG Wun Sing was published by hknet.com in its Topick edition. Here is the link to the article (https://topick.hket.com/article/3265737/). It worth reading the article in full length. Here are some excerpts from the interview with Editor's English translations.

香港一般標準學校設 24 班,喇沙卻有多達 42 班,每級設 7 班,學生人數逾千人,有 90 多名老師。唐煥星校長直言「人多」是喇沙的特色之一,畢業生人數眾多,對學校歸屬感強,畢業後仍樂意參與母校活動。

There are 24 classes in a standard secondary school in Hong Kong, but there are as many as 42 classes in La Salle, with 7 classes in each class year, with more than 1,000 students and 90 teachers. Principal Tang stated that "lots of LaSallians" is one of the characteristics of La Salle. The large number of graduates has a strong sense of belonging to the school, and they are still willing to participate in the activities of his alma mater after graduation.

以每年學界盛事「港九區 D1 中學校際田徑比賽」為例,決賽日總有百多名舊生到場支持,與落場比賽的學生人數相若,甚至試過近 300 名校友出席。

老師和舊生作為學生的『兄長』,我們很珍惜這種『兄弟情』(Brotherhood)。

他認為每個學生都有潛質,學校要給予機會,讓學生的潛質發揮出來,培育他們成為一個人才。

Take the annual academic event "D1 Inter-School Athletics Competition" as an example. On the final day, there are always more than 100 old students present to support the event, which is like the number of students who participant in the competition, and often even nearly 300 alumni attended.

Teachers and old students are the "brothers" of students, and we cherish this kind of "brotherhood".

He believes that every student has potential, and the school should give opportunities to let the potential of students play out and cultivate them to become talents.

獎項不是我們追求的,我們希望學生做到最好『To be the best you can be』,這是他們應有的一種責任感。他們在比賽將潛質發揮出來,得獎我們固然開心,但最主要目的是透過活動,讓學生能學得更好。比起過程及結果,唐校長更重視團隊的賽後檢討,到底有哪些做得好或未如理想的地方,又如何去改善求進。

Awards are not what we pursue, we hope that students can do their best, "To be the best you can be", which is a sense of responsibility they should have. They showed their potential in the competition. We are happy to win the prize, but the main purpose is to enable students to learn better through activities. Compared with the process and results, Principal Tang emphasis more attention to the team's post-match review. What are the areas that are doing well or are not as ideal, and how to improve and make progress.

在中一自行分配學位階段,學校提供 76 個學額,並會面見所有申請的學生,再從中揀選適合的學生進入第二輪面試。同學只是 11、12 歲的小朋友,這不是學科考試,當然有中英數有關的學科問題,但我們透過傾談,大概已知道學生的能力、性格等。

In the F.1 Discretionary Places stage, the school provides 76 seats and interviews all the candidates who applied, then selects suitable candidates for the second round of interviews. The candidates are only 11 or 12-year-old children so this is not in particular a subject test. Of course, there are subject problems related to Chinese and English, but we probably already know the students' abilities, personality, etc.
